

Farnby 'O'

Two speed restriction signs have been fitted courtesy of Stoneybridge . The layout was subsequently taken down and placed back into storage to free up some space for the Spring Open Day and the testing of Northallerton prior to its appearance at Perth show in June.

Clevemoor 'O' Gauge Club Layout

A meeting was held in the club rooms on January 24th 2023. There was a quite a bit of interest shown from the club membership. Initially it was decided on the rough size of the layout (about 36 feet), and suggestions as to possible track layouts were to be asked for from the interested members. A second meeting took place on Tuesday 7th February. Having decided on a track layout construction of the baseboards took place and track laying has commenced. At the time of writing quite a bit of the track work has been laid and also some of the buildings have been constructed. Work is also underway on the electrics.

Von Ryans Express German Narrow Gauge

No progress to report.

Skinningrove Project P4 & Rosedale 'EM'

Due to developments at the Museum there has been quite a change in the fortunes of these two layouts. As the space originally earmarked for the Museums temporary layouts has been condemned as not fit for purpose by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) the space we had been allocated has temporarily been taken from us, possibly for up to a year. Work on the Skinningrove project has led to the two boards already built being placed into store at the Museum. Work on rolling stock/buildings etc will continue on Thursdays in the Education rooms at the museum (when it is not open to the public).

As regards the Rosedale project this was originally planned to be removed from Skinningrove and taken to the North Yorkshire Moors Centre at Danby, which is where it was originally destined to go until Covid interfered. The layout was dismantled on the 13th of April and taken to Danby where it was found that there was not enough room for it to be displayed. As a result it as brought back and at present it is stored in Martin's unit. Subsequently it would appear that as the Moors Centre at Danby are no longer interested in it, it has been gifted to the Club.

After a lot of hand wringing we think we might be getting to the bottom of the problems with the layout electronics. It would seem that some of the servos we have been attempting to use thus far are 'pirate' copies of the genuine articles. These on powering up throw excessively. It was reassembled for the Open Day and it ran well. Prior to its appearance at our main show we were allowed to assemble several boards downstairs in the main room. This enabled us to do a lot of work on the scenic's and track work that were difficult to carry out upstairs. Can Dave B and myself thank all those members who rallied round to help us in our hour of need, without them we could not have presented it as well as we did. Running at an exhibition has given us a clearer view on what we need to prioritise on before its next planned outing in September 2024.

Hambleton Park 'OO'

A significant wiring problem has been identified and rectified. Work has now transferred to sorting out the wiring problems at the front of the layout, i.e. the scenic section. As mentioned last time several club members are working on the area vacated by the over large hill feature and in addition a recently joined junior member has been given an area to work on. In addition Paul has been working on modifying the turntable mechanism, this has now been done and tested, the main job left is the fitting of micro switches to control it.

Kettlewick Bay 'OO'

This layout remains the main means of running members OO stock and continues to work well. It performed well at the open day and was well received by our visitors.

Middleton in Teesdale 'OO'

This layout remains stored prior to a planned outing in 2025 in Middleton in Teesdale to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the Stockton and Darlington Railway.
